Language & Visa Requirements

Language requirements

French and/or English

Language evaluation is required

A mandatory Language Assessment Evaluation will be sent by e-mail to admitted exchange students.

Special visa requirements

Students must have a valid visa upon arrival in Canada

A student visa is delivered by the Canadian authorities of the home country of the exchange student. For more information visit the Canada Immigration web site www.cic.gc.ca

Students must keep a photocopy of all documentation (letter of admission, etc. They may have to show these documents to Canada Customs upon entry to Canada).

Electronic Travel Authorization - New entry requirement now in effect: visa-exempt foreign nationals who fly to or transit through Canada need an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA). Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travellers with a valid Canadian visa. Canadian citizens, including dual citizens, and Canadian permanent residents cannot apply for an eTA

Other

Are incoming exchange students eligible to work in Canada?

Exchange Students can only work on campus, however the number of positions are limited. Students should not count on finding a job in Canada in order to finance their stay.

Health insurance provided on campus

All exchange students must purchase UHIP (Mandatory Ontario University Health Insurance Plan). We strongly recommend that students visit the website of UHIP to obtain more information on the medical coverage offered before purchasing additional insurance in their home country. In most cases, UHIP provides the necessary coverage for medical expenses in Canada.

Student will be enrolled in UHIP when they arrive at Glendon.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All exchange students must confirm their arrival in person by September 30, 2017, Administrative Office Glendon Exchange Program Room C112, York Hall (416 487-6716).

A mandatory orientation session is offered to all international and exchange students. This session will provide students with valuable information that will help them have a successful year in Canada.

Please note that students coming to Glendon must take all their courses on the Glendon Campus. Students will have to register for their Glendon courses online before their arrival, therefore, it is very important to ensure that the selected courses are compatible with their study program at their home university. Course changes are permitted, but are subject to departmental approval and space availability.

Students will have access to their final grades online, however official transcripts are not send automatically to the home university.
