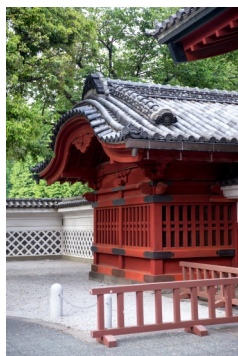

Founded in 1877, the University of Tokyo (UTokyo) is the oldest national university in Japan. Over the course of its long and distinguished history, the university has produced some of the most outstanding scholars, scientists, and social and political leaders of Japan, including eight Nobel laureates, 16 prime ministers of Japan, and one Fields Medal winner. As Japan's most comprehensive research university, UTokyo has ten undergraduate faculties, 15 graduate schools and 26 research institutes. More than 5,600 faculty members teach approximately 14,000 undergraduate students and almost equal number of graduate students. UTokyo has three main campuses in the Tokyo region and additional research facilities across Japan. It also has offices outside Japan such as in Beijing, China, and Bangalore, India.

The faculty members of the UTokyo are engaged in the most advanced research in a wide variety of fields. Our strength lies in interdisciplinary approaches to pressing global issues such as disaster reconstruction or climate change and renewable energy.

UTokyo is committed to excellence in research and education as well as establishing a truly global campus where we hope to produce the next generation of leaders of the world.

About USTEP

USTEP is the University-wide Student Exchange Program for partner universities. Exchange students are allowed to choose between TYPE G (G for Graduate) or TYPE U (U for Undergraduate) program depending on their purpose of participation and/or their proficiency in the English and/or Japanese language. The TYPE G program allows graduate students to take the regular courses where the lectures are predominantly in Japanese. Students will be able to conduct research under the guidance of faculty members in the University's Graduate Schools. Some graduate schools require Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) Level N1. The TYPE U program offers opportunity for overseas undergraduate students to take courses in English and/or Japanese in the various faculties depending on their language proficiency.
