

Academic agreement
between
the Katz Center for Mexican Studies at the University of Chicago
and
El Colegio de México

- 1) Visiting Professorship from El Colegio de México at the University of Chicago
(sponsored by the Katz Center for Mexican Studies)

Once a year, El Colegio de México will nominate professors for a visiting academic appointment at the University of Chicago. A faculty committee from the Katz Center will then review the nominees, and, if a candidate is selected, s/he will be appointed to the relevant Department and Division in accordance with, and subject to, University policies and procedures for visiting appointments.

The visiting professor will spend a regular quarter of residency at the University of Chicago (Autumn, Winter, or Spring). S/he will teach one course (open to graduate students and advanced undergraduates) and conduct his or her own research.

El Colegio de México will continue to pay the regular salary of the visiting professor during his/her appointment at the University of Chicago and will also cover the round-trip flight costs, and offer an additional stipend, subject to budget availability.

The Katz Center will provide health insurance for the visiting professor and will reimburse him/her for up to \$2,500 in research related expenses. The Katz Center will also provide library and internet access, office space, and logistical support for his/her teaching and research activities that is routinely provided to visiting academics.

- 2) Visiting Student from El Colegio de México at the University of Chicago

El Colegio de México will nominate an advanced graduate student (ABD) to spend a quarter of residency at the University of Chicago, with the exception of the summer quarter. A faculty committee from the Katz Center will review the nomination and decide whether or not to endorse it. ABD graduate students will be designated as Non-degree Visiting Students at the University.



El Colegio de México will nominate the student based on an internal competition. The quality of the thesis (MA or Ph.D.) and the overall academic performance will be the main selection criteria.

El Colegio de México will cover all of the visitor's expenses, including travel, lodging, stipend, and health insurance, subject to budget availability. The Katz Center for Mexican Studies will provide library and internet access, assist with housing choices, and cover Non-Degree Visiting Student fees. The visiting student will also be allowed to audit courses (not for credit), subject to the permission of the course instructor. The Katz Center will identify a Chicago faculty member willing to serve as academic advisor for the visiting student.

3) Visiting Student from the University of Chicago at El Colegio de México

This academic stay will be offered to advanced graduate students to help them conduct their doctoral research in Mexico. El Colegio de México will provide internet access as well as access to the library and other student resources regularly provided to its own students.

This agreement will be valid for a period of time of five years, renewable at the end of that period. This agreement may be terminated by either party with six months written notice. It may be amended by mutual agreement.

Provision 1 of this agreement will come into effect once the Katz Center has secured the funds needed to support the visiting professorship.
